- CONSENT CALENDAR (All items on the Consent Calendar are considered to be routine and will be enacted by one motion unless a member of the City Council or member of the audience requests separate discussion.)
 - a. City Council Adjourned and Regular Minutes of May 17, 2021, to be received and filed.
 - b. <u>Register of Audited Demands</u> in the amount of \$1,169,975.51 dated April 29, 2021; in the amount of \$140,964.05 dated May 5, 2021; and in the amount of \$2,236,517.96 in the dated May 13, 2021, *approval recommended by Interim Finance Director Alvarado*.
 - c. <u>Senior Advisory Committee Board Reappointments</u> Terms for Lorraine Missick, Scott Snider, and Bette Donovan expire June 30, 2021. Terry Kistler's term ended June 30, 2020, but due to COVID-19 and missed meetings last year, Terry's term was not reappointed at the time. All four committee members wish to remain on the Senior Advisory Committee.
 - It is recommended by the Community Services Manager Duran that the City Council accept the Senior Advisory Committee's recommendation to reappoint Lorraine Missick, Scott Snider, and Bette Donovan to serve two-year terms from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023 and Terry Kistler from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022.
 - d. Old Town La Verne Business Improvement District Reappointments Terms for Old Town La Verne Business Improvement District Members Craig Walters, Marianne Stark, and Mickey Rehm expire June 30, 2021. All three members wish to remain on the Board.
 - Community Development Director Scherer recommends that the Mayor reappoint Craig Walters, Marianne Stark, and Mickey Rehm to serve two-year terms from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023 with the approval of the City Council.

e. Resolution (s) - Approval and Passage Recommended, as follows:

1. Resolution No. 21-27 - A Resolution OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA AUTHORIZING A PROJECT LIST AS REQUIRED BY Senate BILL 1: The Road Repair and Accountability Act - In April 2017 Governor Brown signed into law Senate Bill 1 (SB1), also referred to as the Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) of 2017. SB1 provides for increased gas taxes and registration fees, which are to be deposited into the State's Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA). RMRA funds are apportioned to local agencies each year for basic road maintenance, rehabilitation, and other safety projects. SB1 also requires each eligible agency to submit a project list to California Transportation Commission (CTC) in order to receive these funds. La Verne's allocation for fiscal year 2021/22 is estimated at \$570,000.

Public Works Director Igoe recommends approval of Resolution No. 21-27, approving the proposed SB1 project list for fiscal year 2021/22.

2. Resolution No. 21-28 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING ANNUAL CITY AGREEMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 - Once a year, the City Council considers annual agreements for renewals or extensions. As such, attached are the service agreements proposed for the coming fiscal year for City Council consideration.

Assistant City Clerk Estrella recommends that the City Council approve the annual City agreements by adopting Resolution No. 21-28, which authorizes the Mayor and Assistant City Clerk to execute the annual agreements as listed on the Resolution.

f. Ordinance (s) - Second Reading, Approval Recommended, as follows:

Ordinance No. 1098 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 18.94 TO REGULATE THE RENTAL OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY ON A SHORT- TERM BASIS AND AMENDING RELATED PROVISIONS - At the Council's May 3, 2021 meeting, a public hearing was conducted and concluded. The Ordinance document required minor technical changes and was brought back to the Council at that meeting with the recommendation to introduce, waive further reading, and place on first reading.

Community Development Director Scherer recommends final approval of Ordinance No. 1098, adding a new Chapter 18.94 to the La Verne Municipal to regulate the rental of residential property on short-term basis and amending related provisions. The Ordinance will take effect on August 17, 2021, when the current moratorium expires.

Old Town La Verne Business Improvement District (OTLVBID) Protest Hearing -This annual public "protest" hearing is required in-order to comply with State Law, the Municipal Code, and By-Laws relative to the Old Town La Verne Business Improvement District (OTLVBID). Following the conduct of the annual "protest" hearing, 1) Council should receive and file a report of the OTLVBID prior year activities; 2) Approve the proposed OTLVBID 2021-2022 Annual Budget, and incorporate it into the overall City Budget; and 3) Approve reestablishment of the District boundaries and assessment formula.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The City Council should following the conduct of the annual "protest" hearing, the City Council adopt the Resolution No.21-29 to approve the OTLVBID Annual Report and effectively:

- Receive and file a report of the OTLVBID prior year activities; and
- 2) Approve the proposed OTLVBID 2021-2022 Annual Budget; and
- 3) Approve re-establishment of the District boundaries and assessment formula
