  - a. <u>City Council Minutes</u> of the regular and adjourned meetings of September 7, 2021, to be received and filed.
  - b. <u>Register of Audited Demands</u> in the amount of \$1,160,588.11 dated August 31, 2021, approval recommended by Finance Director Pendleton.
  - c. Approval of Funding Agreement for Design of Arrow Highway Pedestrian Bridge At their August 16 meeting, the City Council was provided with an update on the design of the pedestrian bridge that would connect the Gold Line Station to the south side of Arrow Highway and Fairplex itself. Through that discussion, the Council directed staff to begin the bridge's final design. While a majority of the design is funded through a Measure M Subregional grant managed by the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG), the City is responsible for the final \$419,000 of that work. As such, SGVCOG has requested the City execute a reimbursement agreement for that portion of the project so the work can be completed.

**City Manager Russi recommends approval of the** reimbursement agreement authorizing the City to reimburse up to \$419,000 of work to complete design of the Arrow Highway Pedestrian Bridge and to appropriate funds from Proposition C fund balance (Fund 234) to support this expense.

## d. Staff recommends approval and passage of the following Resolutions:

1. Resolution No. 21-68 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING TO DETERMINE WHETHER PUBLIC NECESSITY, HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE REQUIRES THE FORMATION OF AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT ALONG ARROW HIGHWAY BETWEEN FAIRPLEX DRIVE/E STREET AND WHITE AVENUE FROM FIRST STREET, TO APPROXIMATELY 600 FEET SOUTH OF ARROW HIGHWAY - Consideration of a Public Hearing regarding the Formation of an Underground Utility District Along Arrow Highway between Fairplex Drive/E Street and White Avenue and along White Avenue from First Street, to approximately 600 Feet south of Arrow Highway. This project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15302 (d) — Conversion of overhead electric utility distribution system facilities to underground including connection to existing overhead electric utility distribution lines where the surface is restored to the condition existing prior to undergrounding.

Public Works Director Igoe recommends approval of Resolution 21-68, calling a Public Hearing on October 18, 2021 to determine whether public necessity, health, safety, or welfare requires the formation of an Underground Utility District along Arrow Highway between Fairplex Drive/E Street and White Avenue and along White Avenue from First Street, to approximately 600 feet south of Arrow Highway.

2. Resolution No. 21-69 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAVERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A FIVE YEAR AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO PROVIDE FOR LANDSCAPE AND GROUNDS MAINTENANCE OF THE COUNTY LIBRARY PROPERTY - The County of Los Angeles is requesting renewal of an existing grounds maintenance agreement with the City for the County Library. The current agreement, which is set to expire on October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021, obligates the City to perform landscape maintenance and related responsibilities around the library in exchange for annual payment of \$4,262 for Fiscal Year 2020-21 with annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustments for the final four years. This action is not considered a project under the California Environmental Quality Act or the City of La Verne environmental guidelines. Therefore, no environmental review is required.

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the attached resolution No. 21–69, authorizing the Mayor to execute the "Landscape and Grounds Maintenance Service Agreement" with the County of Los Angeles.

3. Resolution No. 21-70 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF RECYCLING BINS TO MEET THE GOALS OF THE 2020-2021 BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING GRANT NUMBER RBC32-20-0034. - The City applied for and was successful in obtaining a grant to enhance our beverage container-recycling program through the California Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery. The grant consists of the purchase; installation and use of sixteen water refill/drinking fountain stations and forty-eight outdoor recycling and trash bins. Additionally, there will be an outreach component encouraging the proper use of the new equipment through various measures such as stickers and social media.

Public Works Director Igoe recommends approval of Resolution No.21-70, authorizing an award to Recycle Away in the amount of \$107,618.80 for the purchase of bins through the 2020-2021 Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program.

4. Resolution No. 21-71 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING REQUESTED POSITION CHANGES. - The Finance Division is requesting approval to exchange vacant positions (one full-time and one part-time Account Clerk I) for a professional degreed Accountant I to better serve the needs of the City by performing some of the more complex accounting functions of the division. A budget adjustment is not required during the current year due to timing of recruitment and salary savings related to position vacancies.

Finance Director Pendleton recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 21-71, authorizing requested position changes.

#### 6. **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

Baseline Road Single-Family Residential and Annexation Project - 500 Baseline Road APN: 8666-006-035, Case Nos. 102-18PPR, 59-19ANX, 104-18GPA, 103-18ZC, 101-18 TTM, 60-19TR - Request to Construct Seven Detached Single-family Homes and Two Open Lots - Applicant Ramzy Fakhoury, is proposing to annex an approximate 19.44 acre parcel into the City of La Verne; a General Plan Amendment and Pre-Annexation Zone Change to establish land use and zoning designations for the site; subdivision of this parcel into nine lots for the future development of seven single-family dwelling units and two open space lots located at 500 Baseline Road (8666-006-035) currently within unincorporated Los Angeles County. Staff, the Development Review Committee (DRC) and the Planning Commission recommend the City Council conditionally approve the Baseline Single-Family Residential and Annexation Project, 500 Baseline Road.

## **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

The City Council should based on this report and the conditions of approval in conjunction with DRC tentatively approved Case Nos.102-18PPR and 60-19TR which are contingent on the approval of all related cases together with a subsequent Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) approval of annexation of this property into the City of La Verne, approve Case Nos. 59-19ANX, 104-18GPA, 103-18ZC and 101-18TTM (Vesting Tentative Tract Map Number 082001), adopting Resolution Nos, 21-72, 21-73, 21-74, 21-75 and place on first reading Ordinance No. 1102.

Resolution No. 21-72 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, APPROVING ANNEXATION OF 19.44 ACRES FROM LOS ANGELES UNINCORPORATED COUNTY INTO THE CITY OF LA VERNE LOCATED AT 500 BASELINE ROAD (8666-006-035).

Resolution No. 21-73 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA APPROVING A GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT (CASE NO. 104-18GPA) TO CHANGE THE LAND USE DESIGNATION AT 500 BASELINE ROAD (8666-006-035) FROM HILLSIDE RESIDENTIAL TO LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL.
