- 1. <u>**City Council Minutes**</u> of the regular meeting of March 20, 2023, and the adjourned meeting of March 27, 2023, *to be received and filed.*
- 2. <u>Register of Audited Demands</u> in the amount of \$1,730,454.30 dated March 16, 2023, and in the amount of \$341,486.65 dated March 23, 2023, *approval recommended.*
- 3. <u>Brethren Parking Lot License Agreement</u> The Church of the Brethren and the City of La Verne have agreed to enter into a parking lot license agreement for fifteen years for the use of public parking at the Church's property at 2425 E Street. In exchange for the parking use, the City will trim the parking lot trees, repave/maintain the lot, and make other minor improvements.

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute a Parking Lot license agreement with Church of the Brethren for use of a parking lot located at 2425 E. Street, for a fifteen (15) year term in exchange for listed improvements. 4. <u>2022 Housing Element Annual Progress Report (APR)</u> - The City is required to prepare an Annual Progress Report on the status and progress in implementing the Housing Element of the General Plan. This report is required to be presented to the City Council as an informational item to update the City Council on the previous year's Housing Element status.

It is recommended that the City Council receive and file the Annual Progress Report for 2022.

 Purchase of Shade Structures - La Verne Aquatic Center - This item seeks City Council authorization and award of contract to Miracle Recreation Equipment Company to install permanent shade structures at the Aquatic Center in the amount of \$143,400 with funding from the Proposition 68 Per Capita Grant Program.

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Award the contract to Miracle Recreation Equipment Co. in the amount of \$143,400 for the purchase and installation of permanent shade structures at the La Verne Aquatic Center; and
- 2. Appropriate \$143,400 from the Miscellaneous Grants Fund for the purchase and installation of the shade structures.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

6. <u>Assembly Bill 481 Annual Review</u> - Assembly Bill 481 (AB 481) went into effect on January 1, 2022, requiring law enforcement agencies to obtain approval from their governing bodies to enact a Military Equipment Use Policy before purchasing, using, raising funds for, or acquiring military equipment. AB 481 requires the Policy be approved or renewed by City Council by Ordinance which is to be accompanied with an annual review of the Department's military equipment.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council should introduce by title only and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 1115, amending Chapter 10 ("Military Equipment Policy") of Title 9 Section 10.04.010 of the La Verne Municipal Code governing the use of military equipment by the Police Department and approving the updated Military Equipment Inventory list.

Ordinance No. 1115 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA AMENDING CHAPTER 10 ("MILITARY EQUIPMENT POLICY") OF TITLE 9, SECTION 10.04.010 OF THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE GOVERNING THE USE OF MILITARY EQUIPMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT AND APPROVING THE UPDATED MILITARY EQUIPMENT POLICY 709.

 <u>Resolution Amending Fees for Concealed Carry Weapons (CCW) Permits</u> - On February 21, 2023, the City approved Resolution No. 23-10 amending the City's Fee Schedule to include fees for residents seeking a Concealed Carry Weapon permit (CCW). Based on public comments, a further review of protocols, and City cost recovery allocations, City Council approval of a new resolution setting fees is requested.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council adopt the Resolution No. 23-14, titled:

<u>Resolution No. 23-14</u> - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 23-10 RELATIVE TO CERTAIN FEES AND POLICIES FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY OF LA VERNE, RELATED TO SETTING CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT FEES.
