# **CONSENT CALENDAR**

1. City Council Minutes of special meetings of May 1 & 15, 2023, and regular meeting of May 15, 2023.

**Recommendation:** That the City Council approve the minutes.

2. <u>Register of Audited Demands</u> in the amount of \$1,754,008.62 dated May 11, 2023, and in the amount of \$367,993.56 dated May 18, 2023, and in the amount of \$4,074,746.33 dated May 25, 2023.

**Recommendation**: That the City Councill approve the demands.

3. STREET CLOSURE AGREEMENT FOR THE 2023 BONITA HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION - The City Council is requested to approve a street closure agreement for the 2023 Bonita High School Graduation. The request is to close the entirety of Durward Way on June 8, 2023, from 2:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.

<u>Recommendation:</u> That the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute an Agreement with Bonita High School providing for a temporary street closure of Durward Way for the Bonita High School Graduation occurring June 8, 2023.

4. CONSIDERATION OF STREET CLOSURES FOR "E" STREET AND 2ND STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT - The City Council is requested to approve a series of street closures to facilitate construction work associated with the Enhanced Infrastructure Finance District (EIFD) project under construction on "E" Street and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.

**Recommendation:** That the City Council authorize the Public Works Director to permit the temporary closure of the intersections of "E" Street & 2nd Street, and "D" Street & 2nd Street during the weeks of June 12<sup>th</sup> through 16<sup>th</sup> and June 19<sup>th</sup> through 23<sup>rd</sup> and any other dates for required work that will be in excess of 24 hours to complete construction in a timely manner.

5. **REQUEST FOR ADDITONAL APPROPRIATION – STREETS DUMP TRUCK** - Due to supply chain issues and resulting increased prices, there is a need for an additional appropriation in the amount of \$33,883 from the Street Maintenance Fund to the Equipment Replacement Fund for purchase of the Streets Dump Truck.

**Recommendation:** That the City Council: authorize the transfer of \$33,883 from Street Maintenance - General Fund to the Vehicle Replacement Fund – Fund 64; and Appropriate \$33,883 in the Vehicle Replacement Fund – Fund 64 for the purchase of the Streets Dump Truck.

6. **PURCHASE OF A NEW 7-8 YARD DUMP TRUCK – WATER DIVISION** - This action will authorize replacement of the Water Division's 1993 Ford LN8000 Dump Truck in the amount of \$194,997 and approve an additional appropriation of \$117,029 from the Water Fund to complete the purchase.

Recommendation: That the City Council: authorize the City Manager to execute a purchase order with Velocity Truck Centers/PB Loader Corporation in the amount of \$194,997 for the purchase of a new 2024 Freightliner M2 Chassis with a new 7-8 Yard tilt dump truck body, utilizing competitively bid national contract from Sourcewell (Contract #080521-PBL). Authorize the transfer of \$117,029 from the Water Fund (available within the Fiscal Year 2022-23 Operational Budget) and appropriate this amount within the Vehicle Replacement Fund.

7. LEASE AND SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR PRINTERS AND COPIERS - After a review of the current printer and copier equipment service, staff determined that improved service and reduced costs would occur if they consolidated all the peripherals at City Hall and the City Yard. City Council is asked to approve the attached 5-year lease agreement with Kyocera Document Solutions West.

**Recommendation:** That the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute a lease agreement with Kyocera Document Solutions West, for printer and copier services, for a 63-month term at a base monthly rate of \$1,041.16.

8. **RESOLUTION APPROVING A CLASS SPECIFICATION AND SALARY FOR CODE COMPLIANCE OFFICER** - After a review of organizational structure and departmental efficiencies, the City Manager is transitioning code enforcement activities from the Police Department to the Community Development Department as of July 1, 2023. Code enforcement duties are currently the responsibility of the Police Services Coordinator position and a new classification titled Code Compliance Officer is being created to recognize the transition from the Police Department.

<u>Recommendation:</u> That the City Council adopt the attached Resolution titled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, APPROVING A CLASS SPECIFICATION AND SALARY FOR CODE COMPLIANCE OFFICER."

9. **RESOLUTION ADOPTING A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FOR A NEW THREE-YEAR TERM** - The City participates in the Urban County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program through the Los Angeles Community Development Authority. The proposed Cooperation Agreement is for a new three-year term.

**Recommendation**: That the City Council adopt the attached Resolution No. 23-29 titled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA APPROVING PARTICIPATION IN THE LOS ANGELES URBAN COUNTY PROGRAM" to receive Community Development Block Grants and authorize the City Manager to sign the Cooperation Agreement.

10. **RESOLUTION FOR 2023-24 APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT -** Every year, the City must adopt the annual appropriations limit for expenditures paid by tax proceeds, consistent with the requirements of California law. Appropriations financed by service fees, grants and other non-tax revenues are exempt. The City's proposed 2023-24 budget reflects appropriations well under the limit set by law.

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 23-30 titled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING AN APPROPRIATIONS LIMITATION FOR THE 2023-24 FISCAL YEAR"

11. **RESOLUTION CANCELLING THE JULY 3, 2023, CITY COUNCIL MEETING** - Traditionally, the first City Council meeting in July is cancelled due to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday and reduced Council items requiring action at the start of the new Fiscal Year. This item approves a Resolution cancelling the meeting.

**Recommendation:** That the City Council approve Resolution 23-31, cancelling the July 3, 2023, City Council Meeting.

12. ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE, NO. 1116 PERTAINING TO UPDATES AND MODIFICATIONS TO THE CITY'S EXISTING ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS (ADUs) PROVISIONS - The City Council approved the First Reading of Ordinance No. 1116, with amendments, pertaining to updates and modifications to the City's Accessory Dwelling Unit regulations on May 15, 2023. If approved, this action will adopt the Ordinance which will be effective thirty (30) days after adoption.

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt Ordinance No. 1116 titled, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA AMENDINNG THE ZONING PROVISIONS OF THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS AND JUNIOR ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE LAW."

13. ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 1117 MODIFYING TITLE 16 & TITLE 18 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING SENATE BILL 9 DEVELOPMENT - The proposed Ordinance establishes the objective development standards for Senate Bill 9 (SB 9) two-unit and urban lot split developments in the City of La Verne in accordance with State law and based on feedback and direction received from the City Council at the First Reading approved on May 15, 2023.

**Recommendation:** That the City Council adopt Ordinance No. 1117, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA MODIFYING TITLE 16 (SUBDIVISIONS) AND TITLE 18 (ZONING) OF THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF SENATE BILL 9 RELATING TO THE CREATION OF URBAN LOT SPLITS AND TWO RESIDENTIAL UNIT DEVELOPMENT."

#### JOINT PUBLIC FINANCING AUTHORITY

14. RESOLUTION NO. JPFA-66 GRANTING AN EASEMENT TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY FOR UTILITY PURPOSES FOR 2909 ARROW HIGHWAY (VALLEY RANCHO MOBILE HOME PARK) - The attached resolution grants an easement to Southern California Gas Company for utility purposes at the Valley Rancho Mobile Home Park which is owned by the La Verne Public Financing Authority. This easement will allow the conversion of the current utility infrastructure for natural gas to be replaced, improved, and transferred.

Recommendation: Adopt Resolution No. JPFA-66 titled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE LA VERNE PUBLIC FINANCING AUTHORITY, GRANTING AN EASEMENT TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY FOR UTILITY PURPOSES FOR 2909 ARROW HIGHWAY (VALLEY RANCHO MOBILE HOME PARK)."

# **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

15. ANNUAL REPORT AND PUBLIC PROTEST HEARING FOR OLD TOWN LA VERNE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE NO. 1118 REGARDING EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS, AND DETERMINING ACTION IS EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT - An annual public protest hearing is required to comply with State Law, the Municipal Code, and By-Laws relative to the Old Town La Verne Business Improvement District (District). The Council will review the annual report, the proposed budget, re-establish the District, and modify the La Verne Municipal Code.

Recommendation: That the City Council Adopt Resolution No. 23-32, approving the District's Annual Report, proposed 2023-2024 Annual Budget, and the re-establishment of the District boundaries and assessment formula; and Introduce by title only and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 1118, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA AMENDING CHAPTER 2.54.150 OF THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE RELATIVE TO THE OLD TOWN LA VERNE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD'S EXPENDITURE OF CITY FUNDS," and making a determination that the adoption of the ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act.

16. **RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE 2023-24 COMPREHENSIVE FEE SCHEDULE** - The City's Comprehensive Fee Schedule, established by Resolution 23-14, is reviewed each year in conjunction with the annual budget process. Adjustments are made to reflect changes in the cost of services in accordance with State and local law. Resolution 23-33 provides for adjustments to the 2023-24 Comprehensive Fee Schedule.

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt the Resolution No. 23-33 titled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 23-14 RELATIVE TO CERTAIN FEES AND POLICIES FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY OF LA VERNE."

17. FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE NO. 1119, ESTABLISHING THAT REGULAR MEETING TIMES OF THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL BE SET BY RESOLUTION - Currently, La Verne Municipal Code provides that regular meetings of the City Council shall be held on the first and third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. In order to provide better flexibility as well as convenience, the proposed ordinance authorizes the City Council to establish regular meeting times by resolution.

Recommendation: That the City Council should introduce by title only and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 1119, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING THAT REGULAR MEETING TIMES OF THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL BE SET BY RESOLUTION."

18. Water Quality Resin Changeout – Amherst Water Treatment Plant - This action will approve a sole source purchase agreement for resin replacement (Cal Res 2109) from Calgon Carbon in the amount of \$152,688. The media is necessary for the removal of perchlorate from drinking water.

<u>Recommendation:</u> That City Council authorize a sole source purchase from Calgon Carbon for Cal Res 2109 perchlorate media (resin) replacement at Amherst Treatment Plant, including the removal and incineration of spent media, in the amount of \$152,688.
