2. Council Member Swearing-in Ceremony and City Council Reorganization Council Member Rick Crosby and Council Member Wendy Lau were appointed to four-year terms on the City Council via Resolution No. 23-88 on December 18, 2023, due to no other persons filing for candidacy for Districts 2 and 5 within the established nomination period. Following, the City Council shall reorganize by selecting a Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem.

Recommendation: That the City Council swear in the following persons for a four-year term beginning April 1, 2024:

- Wendy Lau, Council Member, Fifth District

Following Ceremonies for Swearing-in Council Members, the City Council shall reorganize by selecting a Mayor and then a Mayor Pro Tem, until such time as the next reorganization.

- 5. Award of Contract for FY 23-24 CDBG Curb Ramp Improvements Project This action will award a construction contract to Woodland's General Contracting LLC in the amount of \$51,609.54 for the Hayes Dr. and King St. et al. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Curb Ramp Improvements Project. The project will be funded by CDBG funds within FY 23-24 Adopted Budget for the removal of existing curb ramps and replacement with accessible curb ramps meeting current standards.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Determine this project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act, Section 15301 Existing Facilities, and the City of La Verne environmental guidelines and affirms the State's determination of a Categorical Exclusion under NEPA, 23 CFR 771.117(c): activity (c)(4):
- Award a public works construction contract to Woodland's General Contracting LLC, the lowest, most responsible bidder, in the amount of \$51,609.54 for the Hayes Dr. and King St. et al. CDBG Curb Ramp Improvement Project (Proj. No. PK2403);
- 3. Authorize staff to issue change orders not exceeding 10% of the construction budget for a total possible cost of \$56,770.49; and
- 4. Authorize an appropriation of \$56,770.49 from available CDBG funds within the FY 23-24 Adopted Budget to the Hayes Dr. and King St. Et al. Community Development Block Grant Curb Ramp Improvements Project.

6. 2023 Housing Element Annual Progress Report (APR) - The City is required to prepare an Annual Progress Report on the status and progress in implementing the Housing Element of the General Plan. This report is required to be presented to the City Council as an informational item to update the City Council on the previous year's Housing Element status.

Recommendation: That the City Council receive and file the Housing Element Annual Progress Report for 2023.

7. Adoption of Ordinance No. 24-1126 - Military Equipment Policy (AB481) - Under Assembly Bill 481 ("AB 481") the City Council is required to annually renew the Police Department's Military Equipment Use Policy and Inventory through adoption of an ordinance.

Recommendation: That the City Council approve a motion to waive further readings and adopt Ordinance No. 24-1126, "AN UNCODIFIED ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, CALIFORNIA AMENDING CHAPTER 10 ("MILITARY EQUIPMENT POLICY") OF TITLE 9, SECTION 10.4.010 OF THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE GOVERNING THE USE OF MILITARY EQUIPMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT AND APPROVING THE UPDATED MILITARY EQUIPMENT POLICY 709".

8. 2023-24 MID-YEAR BUDGET UPDATE - The 2023-24 Budget was approved by the City Council on June 19, 2023. Based on economic changes and organizational challenges that have occurred since then, the Finance Division is providing a mid-year financial update report for the 2023-24 fiscal year. Updated estimates have resulted in an expenditure increase of \$610,588 in the General Fund balanced by an increase of \$610,588 of revenue or transfers for a zero net impact to the General Fund.

Recommendation: That the City Council approve resolution 24-XX titled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-24 ADOPTED BUDGET TO ADJUST FOR THE MID YEAR ECONOMIC CHANGES."
