4. PRESENTATIONS:

<u>Introductions and Presentation</u> - Representatives from Tri-City Mental Health Center and Union Station Homeless Services will provide Council with an introduction to their Navigators, as well as a brief presentation on the work they do in La Verne. The Navigators specialize in providing resources, services, and outreach to individuals experiencing, or on the cusp of experiencing, homelessness. The Navigators were hired through grant funds awarded as part of the County of Los Angeles' 2018 Cities Homelessness Plan Implementation Program, and are a critical part of the City's strategic efforts to prevent and address homelessness.

Interim Finance Director Alvarado recommends approval.

- c. Treasurer's Report for the month of June. 2020, to be received and filed.
- d. <u>Server and Software Purchase Fund Appropriation</u> During a review of this current fiscal year, it was believed that the Police Department could postpone purchase of digital software components. Since that time there have been events where the servers have failed due to outdated components. As such, it has been determined that it would be disruptive to operations to further delay their replacement.

Police Chief Paz recommends that the City Council appropriate \$23,000 from the General Fund to be transferred to the Department's Administration Fund (101) to purchase a replacement network server.

e. Homeless Plan Annual Review - On June 18, 2018 the City Council approved Resolution No. 18-33, adopting the City's "Plan to Prevent and Reduce Homelessness" (Homeless Plan). The adopted Homeless Plan outlines four (4) strategic goals, along with supporting action items, to prevent and reduce homelessness over the course of three (3) years. Action item 4b identifies that the Homeless Plan should be reviewed on an annual basis at a time corresponding with, or after, the release of the most recent annual Point in Time Homeless Count results. This staff report summarizes the progress that has occurred since the last progress report was provided to City Council in July 2019.

Community Development Director Scherer recommends that the City Council receive and file this informational report.

f. Staff recommends approval and passage of Ordinance (s) 2nd reading

Ordinance No. 1096 - Repeal and Replace Chapter 13.28 - Refuse Collection, of the La Verne Municipal Code - Since the last update in 1996 of Chapter 13.28 - Refuse Collection (Chapter 13.28) of the La Verne Municipal Code has had significant changes in State law pertaining to the collection, removal and disposal of refuse. Each year, the City is required to demonstrate compliance efforts in the Electronic Annual Report (EAR) submitted to CalRecycle, the State's regulatory agency that oversees California's State-managed waste handling and recycling programs.

Interim Public Works Director Keesey recommends approval of Ordinance No. 1096, as follows:

<u>Ordinance No. 1096</u> - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, TO REPEAL AND REPLACE CHAPTER 13.28 - REFUSE COLLECTION, OF TITLE 13 OF THE LA VERNE MUNICIPAL CODE.

7. OTHER MATTERS

Ordinance No. 1097 - Amending Title 9 of the La Verne Municipal Code Pertaining to the Regulation of Possession of Certain Items at Public Protests, Demonstrations, Picket Lines and Public Assemblies - The Police Department staff attended a training course focused on how to improve their approach of ensuring that public protests, demonstrations, and rallies remain peaceful and safe for all involved. In addition to several operational changes, the subject matter experts recommend that the City's Municipal Code should allow for the prohibition of items at such events that may cause harm to the community or against law enforcement. Since the City's Municipal code is silent on the matter, the Police Department is seeking Council concurrence to amend the Municipal Code to regulate such items for the protection of the participants, community, and officers.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The City Council should place on first reading and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 1097, amending Title 9 of the La Verne Municipal Code by adding a new Section 9.21.00 (b) to regulate the possession of certain items at public protests, demonstrations, rallies, picket lines, and public assemblies.

Ordinance No. 1097 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING TITLE 9 (PUBLIC PEACE, MORALS, AND SAFETY) OF THE LA VERNE MUNICPAL CODE BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 9.21.00 (b) TO REGULATE THE POSSESSION OF CERTAIN ITEMS AT PUBLIC PROTESTS, DEMONSTRATIONS, RALLIES, PICKET LINES AND PUBLIC ASSEMBLIES AND FINDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE IS EXEMPT FROM CEQA PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15060
